

# FROM ST. MARY'S FIVE

Caridi, McGraw and Olesiewicz Star as Locals Gain  
43-34 Victory

## 13TH WIN FOR BARRYMEN

Combining speed, accurate passing and exceptional all-around floor work, the courtmen of Camden Catholic repulsed St. Mary's High, of Perth Amboy, by 43-34 before a throng of 600 at Convention Hall last night.

The minions of Joe Barry, although stacking up against a big, lightning-like passing aggregation, outpaced and outgeneraled the up-staters for their 13th victory out of 15 trips to the woodwork. It was Catholic's best performance in two weeks who appear to have sharpened their guns for next Saturday's crucial city series game against Woodrow Wilson. The "Fighting Irish" gained a one-point decision over St. Mary's at Perth Amboy earlier in the season.

Joe Caridi, an anemic scorer in previous games, came to life against the Middlesex county courtmen and counted five double-deckers and two charity throws for an even dozen markers. The majority of his heaves were from close range. John McGraw, energetic little forward, and Bob "Ossie" Olesiewicz, as usual, aided the cause. "Muggsie" tied Caridi on field goals, but failed to get a chance from the free throw station, while Olesiewicz registered five out of seven charity attempts and came through with a trio of two-pointers.

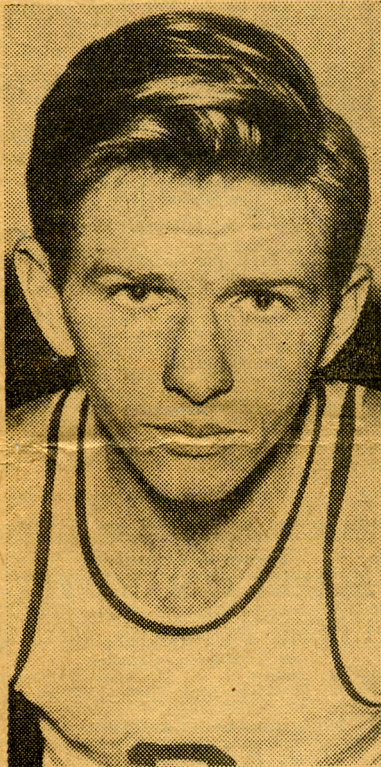
### Irish Score in Close

Three-fourths of Catholic's action shots were garnered from inside the foul line. The invaders, however, failed to fathom the locals' zone defense and were content to stay back and fire away at long range. Their aim was extraordinary as 14 flips sailed through the meshes, one less than the winner's total.

Jim Zawadsky, with a build like a fullback, was top man for St. Mary's. He collected 12 markers on four twin-cylinders and the same number of charity tosses. Captain Bob Handerhan looped in three mid-court throws as did "Lefty" Buchan.

The score was tied on four occasions but as the game progressed the "Irish" improved. They were held to 8-8 at the end of the first quarter, but rallied in the next semester to sport an 19-15 advantage at first-half intermission. Both clubs were again on a par in the scoring column during the third chucker, each coming through with a brace of action shots and one foul.

### Irish Go Wild in Final

In the last session, the most exciting of the battle, the Barrymen donned their scoring suits and racked up 19 points, five better than Perth Amboy's representatives. Caridi's work in this session was noteworthy as nine of his 12 digits came in this stanza.

Stanley Pucilowski, with five-out-of-five from the 15-foot stripe, aided the Irish's offensive in the late stages. Stan, who was blanked from the field, scored the first two double-deckers of the game but both were ruled out on account of running.

Both clubs battled hard and action was exceptionally tough under the basket as four players from each team generally barged in to retrieve rebound shots.
